## Learning for the week beginning Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March

- We continue working in different groups for our phonics lessons and this is what we shall be learning this coming week:
  - Mrs Clarke's group will continue revising all of the set 2 sounds that we have learned.
  - Mrs Damacus's group will also be revising previous set 2 sounds learned and tricky words.
  - > Ms White's group will be revising sounds learned so far and blending.
  - Miss King's group will be revising some of the set 1 sounds, special friends and tricky words.
- We will be continuing our 'Life cycles' topic, looking carefully at the tadpoles we have in the water tank outdoors, observing and discussing all the changes they go through on their journey to becoming frogs.
- In maths we will revise 2D and 3D shapes and we will talk about their properties.
- In RE we will continue our 'Growing' topic. This week we will be teaching the children about Holy Week and Easter.
- Our word of the week is 'Easter'.
