Next Week's Curriculum:

ENGLISH: our learning will be based on *The Magic Paintbrush* by Julia Donaldson.

Reading focus: Sequencing of events to follow the plot.

Writing focus: Children will write a letter about an event in the story.

Grammar focus: Word families based on common words, showing how words are related in form and meaning.

Spelling focus: Words with endings -sure, -ture, -cher, -tcher.

FRENCH:

The children will be learning how to speak about themselves in French; saying their name, age and birthday, talk about their family and count to 10.

Science Topic: Is it magic?

We will be starting our new topic on magnets.

P.E TOPIC: Invasion games

The child will be learning hockey with their PE coach, Miss Cook.
