Next Week's Curriculum:

ENGLISH: Bee and Me

Grammar focus: Use of language to convey meaning

Writing focus: We will be writing a diary based on the emotions of the main character.

Spelling focus: After half term, we will be continuing to learn to spell words with /ei/ sound spelt ei or eigh. Please ensure that your child learns these for a test on Friday.

MATHS: We will be revising all that we have learnt about fractions and apply these to problem solving.

GEOGRAPHY: Our Big Question is why is London such a cool place to live?

We will be discussing why we love London and why it is such a cool place to live. We will be using our survey skills to produce data.

There are differing levels available to watch - please ask your child which CLIC they have been studying in class.
