Next Week's Curriculum:

ENGLISH: Street Child by Berlie Doherty

Grammar focus: Present perfect tense and conjunctions

Writing focus: We will be writing a letter from the point of view of one of the main characters.

Spelling focus: We will continue to learn to spell words with /ei/ sound spelt **ei** or **eigh**. Please ensure that your child learns these for a test on Friday. We are also revising the Year 3 and 4 wordlists (see centre pages of Reading Record Books).

P.E TOPIC: (PE kits should be in school from **Mon for the whole week**)

Teacher-led lesson: Athletics - throwing skills

Coaches: Striking and Fielding Games, Tennis and Rounders

Soundstart: The children will continue to learn their instrument with the Croydon Music Service teachers. Please continue to encourage your child to practise playing at home.

FRENCH: This term, the children will be taught by Madame Severine alongside their class teacher. The focus will be on learning about parts of the body and objects found in the classroom through various stories.

COMPUTING:

We will be using the DoInk App to put together their greenscreen videos.

MATHS: We will be learning about converting units of measure including distance and time (ml to litres, metres to cm, seconds to minutes/hours).

SCIENCE: **How do we make poo? (Science driver)**

The children will be learning about food chains of different animals.

R.E TOPIC:

We will be learning about the importance of forgiveness and reconciliation.

MUSIC / DANCE / ART: ARTS WEEK

The children will be learning The Wellerman Sea Shanty song and working on the skill on keeping to the rhythm using drums and body percussion. They will be choreographing a dance to the music and recording their performance.
