### **Next Week's Curriculum:**

**ENGLISH:** Bee and Me (Picture Book)

**Grammar focus:** Use of language to convey meaning - poetic features (alliteration, personification, similes, onomatopoeia and imagery).

**Writing focus:** We will be writing a free verse poem, based on the events of the story.

Spelling focus: After half term, we will be continuing to learn to spell words with /ei/ sound spelt ei or eigh. Please ensure that your child learns these for a test on Friday.

**MATHS:** We will be learning about money, giving change and related worded problems.

**SCIENCE**: How do we make poo? (Science driver)

The children will be learning about different types of teeth, their structure and how they help us to process the food we eat.

# P.E TOPIC: (PE kits should be in school from Mon for the whole week)

Teacher-led lesson: Athletics - throwing skills

Coaches: Striking and Fielding Games, Tennis and Rounders

BUG CLUB READING: Please complete the book entitled Night of the Dragon up to page 24.

Please note: Your child is able to change their book whenever they have finished reading it, using books from our class book corner. Please make a note of the date, book title, pages read and comment briefly on how well they have read to you. You could note how fluent their reading was, if they are enjoying it and any words you have helped them read or understand. Your child should be reading at least 20 MINS PER DAY. If you have any problems accessing Bug Club on the ActiveLearn platform, please let us know.

SPELLING: Please see the worksheet provided and learn the words for a test on Friday. We are also learning the spellings from the Year 3 /4 National Curriculum wordlist - this can be found in the centre pages of your Reading Record Book.

MATHS: Please complete the sheet provided. Please also see the CLIC practise videos we have uploaded to our class Gsuite page (click on the link from our school website) to go over any questions your child may be struggling with in maths. There are differing levels available to watch - please ask your child which CLIC they have been studying in class.

This is the link to help your child practise their times tables - it is designed to be very similar in format to the test they will be having over the next couple of weeks.
