## **Reception Baseline Assessment**



## **Learning for the week commencing 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2023**

We will be teaching the children the sounds s and d





At the end of the week the first QR code will be stuck in the back of your child's reading record book. You can scan it and find a useful video that takes you through the first 4 sounds that we have learned in school.

- In maths we will be learning about the number 1 and looking at many different representations of the number such as: coins, dice, fingers, tally marks etc.
- In RE we will be reading a verse from Isaiah in the Bible which tells us that God knows us all individually by our names and loves us all.
- Our story of the week will be We are all Different
