ENGLISH:

Reading Focus: Coming to England by Floella

Benjamin

Writing Focus: Biography

Grammar Focus: Adverbials for Cohesion

SCIENCE: Forces

Next week, we will be ending our 'Forces' topic in a practical way. The children will be exploring the different mechanisms including pulleys, levers and gears. Once children understand where these mechanisms are used, we will have a go at building some of our own mechanisms using K-Nex!

COMPUTING: Databases / ART: Romero Britto

Next week in Computing, the children will be using websites to populate their own databases on Excel before displaying this information in the form of bar graphs and pie charts. In art, we will be exploring the work of Brazilian artist Romero Britto and attempting to emulate his style in our own drawings of rainforest animals.

MATHS:
