Blue Blazer (optional)

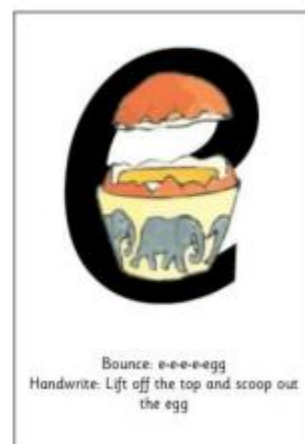
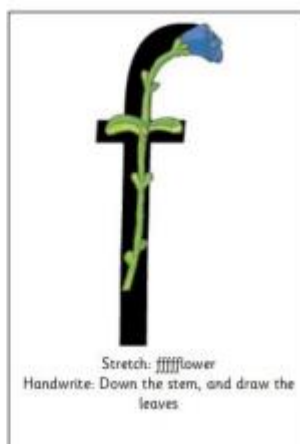
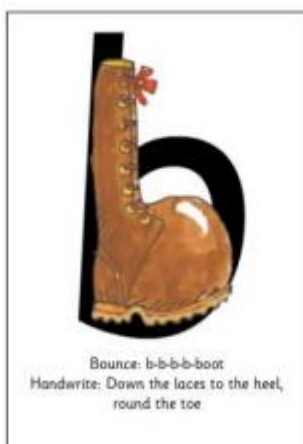
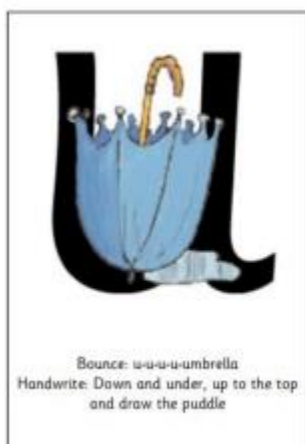
GIRLS
